

Northwest Nassau Natural Gas Reliability Project

Roslyn Heights and Village of Old Westbury Regulator Stations

Overview

National Grid is making a multi-million dollar investment to modernize our natural gas system in Northwest Nassau County. This project, known as the Northwest Nassau Natural Gas Reliability Project, will help improve safety and reliability, and provide Long Island's gas system with greater operational flexibility. It will also improve the gas system's capacity to support economic growth.

The project started in June 2017 when National Grid began the installation of 1.82 miles of new gas main on the LIE North Service Road starting from Pinetree Lane in Old Westbury and ending on Jefferson Avenue in Roslyn Heights.

Next Phase Timeline*

As part of the next phase of construction, we are in the process of installing two underground gas regulator stations – one in Roslyn Heights and one in the Village of Old Westbury - and associated piping to connect them to existing infrastructure. Regulator stations play an important role in the delivery of gas to our customers, ensuring that fuel is able to reach each and every home and business that we serve. These stations also provide an added safety feature and enhanced maintenance capabilities for our regional gas system as they continuously monitor system gas flow, and provide the ability to make adjustments to better serve local energy needs.

We use cutting edge computer programs at our regional gas control center and at our regulator stations to evaluate the delivery capacity of the network, and to ensure that all customers receive adequate supplies of gas to their homes and businesses. Regulator station construction began in summer 2018 with an anticipated completion date by summer 2019.

We have also begun installing approximately two miles of new underground gas main along Locust Lane at Old Westbury Road in Roslyn Heights, with plans to continue to the intersection with Roslyn Road and extend to East Williston Avenue. We began construction on the pipeline in fall 2018 and anticipate completing this segment by summer 2019.

Our Commitment

We plan to construct the new infrastructure safely and reliably while acting as good neighbors and share information widely so that we can continue to serve our community well into the future. Throughout the project, we will make every possible effort to update our commercial and residential customers and other residents about upcoming actions, impacts and road closures, and maintain an open and proactive dialogue about the project with our neighbors and our partners in Nassau County.
